Some of the things happening this year in the Vocation Office:

We are doing a series of "Come and See" dinners throughout the Diocese. These are regional dinners where priests of a certain area invite men from their parish that they believe might have a vocation for an evening Mass, dinner, and vocation talk. So far,

we have done 6 this fall, and have begun making our plans for the spring.

Each month there are two opportunities for those in discernment to come together. On the 2nd Thursday of the month at the Cathedral in St. Joseph, and on the 3rd Thursday of the month at Good Counsel. We had 9 young men at the last discernment night at Good Counsel, with more men expressing interest in coming this month.

There are multiple high school seniors that are currently contemplating seminary for next year. Please keep these men in your prayers.

We will be hosting a weekend "Quo Vadis" retreat in January. We are currently securing our location as well as building a page on our website with details.

I have finished the last of my seminary visits for the fall. I visit each seminary twice a year: once in the fall and once in the spring. All our seminarians are doing well.

I have been in touch with the Serra Club about the Christmas Mass and Dinner at St. Thomas More. It looks like this year we will still have the Mass but won't have the dinner, like in previous years.

After some delays, we are starting to make progress on the Discernment House we are building on the 3rd floor of the Our Lady of Good Counsel Rectory. I know one member of the Downtown Club initially made an investment to assist in this project. Recently, the Northland Club made a donation as well.

I am excited to host everyone for an upcoming evening at Good Counsel.

Please continue to pray for our 22 men in formation, and for me.

- 7. We instituted our "12:25 PM daily prayer" for vocations- keep the prayers coming.
- 8. Provided the planning and support for "priest appreciation day" of golf, lunch and dinner at Lions Gate Golf Course (thank you to all who volunteered their time to make this an overwhelming success-it was a great day.)

It looks like our coming quarter will be much of the same although the officers and trustees are working to develop some different activities to support vocations. We'll keep you posted. And please send me your ideas and thoughts.

We are looking forward to honoring our Seminarians and their families with mass celebrated by Bishop Johnston, on December 21st. Stay tuned for Mass time as it may change from our usual time. District Governor's Letter from Jerry Haake

Stymied by the Covid-19 Virus but not knocked out, our three local clubs, and one in formation in St. Joseph, keep pushing forward to keep members updated and to be creative. By way of meeting in person where and when allowed by local dictate and meeting by Zoom, FreeConferenceCall.com or other virtual means, we have kept the mission and ministry of our Serra commitment in focus.

Though we have had to cancel functions like Blisters for Sisters, our Tri-Club Mass & lunch with the Bishop, repurpose the Seminarian annual retreat at the lake with the Bishop, regular officer installations being abbreviated, cancel the November Chili Dinner event, the Partnering for Future Priests going to virtual and the SOS annual event becoming virtual, along with many other deviations, we still don't stop praying and finding ways to be supportive to the valued vocations we have in place and the new ones we know need to occur for the strength of our Church.

Fellow Serrans of District 12-2E let us all keep in our arsenal of action the awareness to make calls to our fellow members who we have not seen or been around for a number of months, to check in on them and keep them feeling welcome as important to the Serra family. Somethings to consider:

1) The duty of citizens to contribute along with the civil authorities to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom. The love and service of one's country follows from the duty of gratitude and belongs to the order of charity. Submission to legitimate authorities and service of the common good require citizens to fulfill their roles in the life of the political community.

Submission to authority and co-responsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country: Pay to all of them their dues, taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due." - Catechism of the Catholic Church 2239-2240

2) "Conscience must be informed and moral judgment enlightened." "The education of the conscience is a lifelong task."

"In the formation of conscience the Word of God is the light for our path,⁵⁴ we must assimilate it in faith and prayer and put it into practice. We must also examine our conscience before the Lord's Cross." - CCC 1783-1785

"Yet it can happen that moral conscience remains in ignorance and makes erroneous judgments about acts to be performed or already committed. This ignorance can often be imputed to personal responsibility. This is the case when a man "takes little trouble to find out what is true and good, or when conscience is by degrees almost blinded through the habit of committing sin." **In such cases, the person is culpable for the evil he commits.**

Ignorance of Christ and his Gospel, bad example given by others, enslavement to one's passions, assertion of a mistaken notion of autonomy of conscience, rejection of the Church's authority and her teaching, lack of conversion and of charity: these can be at the source of errors of judgment in moral conduct." - CCC 1791-1792

3) "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." - John 13:34

"If I have all faith so as to move mountains but do not have love, I am nothing." - 1 Corinthians 13:2

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn* the world, but that the world might be saved through him." - John 3:16-17






